

Teaching about Drugs, Alcohol and Tobacco

In accordance with applicable law, the district shall provide age-appropriate, developmentally based drug, alcohol and tobacco education and prevention programs from early childhood (preschool) through grade 12.

The drug, alcohol and tobacco education program shall address the legal, social and health consequences of drug, alcohol and tobacco use. It shall include special instruction as to the effects upon the human system; the emotional, psychological and social dangers of such use with emphasis on non-use by school-age children, and the illegal aspects of such use. The program also shall include information about effective techniques for making healthy decisions and resisting peer pressure to use illicit drugs, alcohol or tobacco.
